## Solution: The Gnomes of Zurich (Switzerland) By Susan Glass and Aaron Fuegi

The photos on the first two pages all feature famous landmarks from 13 different countries. In each "week" of the puzzle, each country is related to one of the answers in some way.

The trick for Week 1 is to figure out that each answer word or phrase includes the letters of one country's currency, in order through the answer. Although the name of the landmark is not relevant to solving the puzzle and is only used to identify the country/currency, we're including it here in the table below. The order of the countries in the pictures matches the order of the answer boxes in week 1.

Week 2 involves identifying celebrities born in each of the countries from their quotes. The puzzle answers are in order of the celebrity name (first last). Some letters are available by transferring them from Week 1 answers as clued such as E3 refers to the third letter of the Switzerland answer: Frank Capra; spaces are counted here and that is indicted by the number lines at the top and bottom. The same is done from W2 to W3 with N-Z.

Week 3 answers are loan words from languages spoken in each of the countries. When possible we used words specifically originating in that country, although for Switzerland we just picked a German word. For England, we used a term that is only in UK English and not American English.

The unclued first letters of the week 3 answers in the given order spell out the puzzle answer phrase "**Apt Tautou Film**". This clues the movie Amelie where Tautou's title character encourages her father to start traveling by stealing his garden gnome and sending it around the world with her flight attendant friend, sending back photos of the gnome at famous landmarks having a grand time traveling the world.
